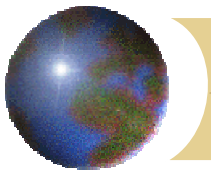


Field of Study Distribution 2003-04

Based on national data for research institutions

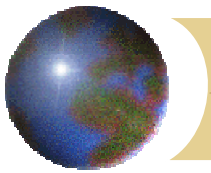

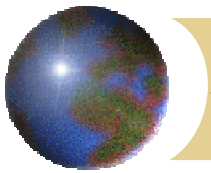
Among the Urban 13, the average percentage is 4.4%, and there are only three institutions with percentages lower than IUPUI.

- If IUPUI were to increase to 1800 international students AND if these students were distributed according to national patterns, there would be the following numbers in each of the following categories

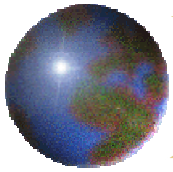
